
Student reports: In March this year, College leadership began a review of the written reports that are provided to families via Daymap. In the survey, parents expressed concerns about the generic nature of the reports, and the amount and quality of the information that we provide. We're negotiating with Daymap to develop different types of reports which are tailored to the needs of families with children in particular age groups. As a result, in 2023 we hope to have *different styles* of reports for student in:

- Years Reception to Year 2,
- Years 3 to 6 and
- Years 7-12.


Communication: Parents reported in the survey that they find it difficult to contact members of staff and that some enquiries go unanswered. We will work with our staff to address this concern, and will publish a *clear set* of expectations relating to communications early in 2023; this document will be emailed to families and available to download from our website.

We'll be working to streamline the use of Daymap for parents and students (Years 5-12) and provide additional support for families who are struggling with the Daymap.


REMEMBRANCE DAY

GUEST SPEAKER: AMER EL-HOSNI

It was a great pleasure to welcome back former ARFA scholar, Amer El-Hosni as guest speaker for our Year 7 and 8 ARFA classes. Amer is one of our favourite old scholars and we are incredibly proud of the young man he has become and of his achievements since graduation. After completing Year 12 in 2019 as Sports Captain, Amer won a Sports Traineeship at Cabra College and has followed this with a dual role in 2022 working with the SANFL and co-ordinating the *Bachar Houli Foundation* in South Australia. Amer was the first SA member of the *Bachar Houli Foundation* as a younger player and is enjoying playing a role in building stronger links between our Muslim community and the great sport of Australian Football.

EARLYACT UPDATE

During Week 7, the Earlyact Prefects presented students with an update on the projects undertaken in 2022.

BLIND CRICKET AUSTRALIA

2022 SOUTH AUSTRALIAN SPORTS AWARDS

Congratulations to Year 9 student, Adeline R who won the *Active Inclusion Award* at the 2022 South Australian Sports Awards. Adeline was recognised for her work pioneering Women's Blind Cricket.

At the age of 14, Adeline identified a gap in cricket opportunities – there was no Women's Blind Cricket Team. Rather than accept things the way they were, Adeline took on the challenge to champion a female-only team in South Australia.

As an avid player herself, she worked hard to turn her idea into a reality, with Blind Cricket SA now sporting 10 female participants – the most of any Blind Cricket Club in the country and the only women's and girls' program in the country. Adeline has shown tremendous dedication to the sport and passion to grow the game.

MATHS COMPETITION

During Term 3, CCC students participated in a range of competitions, achieving outstanding results. Our worthy Year 7-10 students recently received their competition certificates and medals attained in ICAS and Australian Mathematics competitions - a 75-minute paper which tested their mathematical problem-solving skills. 
