For sharing videos, questions can be embedded throughout the video as a formative assessment tool. Monitoring is easy to access - to see which students have or haven't engaged with the content. Existing content is anything within Edpuzzle, and all of Youtube.

Simple and easy to use both from staff and student perspective. Direct links to tasks can be copied and pasted into Daymap.

Creating your own account is simple and straightforward and students can easily create their own accounts.

Here are some other ways ClickView can help support your student's learning needs remotely.

1. Use ClickView Content.

All of the videos that are produced by Clickview come with excellent resources such as lesson plans, comprehension questions and activities for students. Additionally many other videos also have interactive resources that have been created by other teachers that you can automatically use.

2. Create Content

You can use your smartphone or computer to record messages, lessons, tutorials, exercises – you name it – to upload to your Workspace and share with your students. You can even add a layer of questions and annotations using the interactive tool.

3. Create interactive videos with quiz and short answer responses.

Any video on ClickView can be turned into an interactive video. You can set a wide range of different question types that will auto mark as well as short answer responses. When the students watch the interactive video it will automatically pause and they will need to answer the question before they can go on. For a super simple video on how to create an interactive video watch this quick tutorial https://clickv.ie/w/29_I Analytics are available when students have completed watching the video including how long they spent watching the video and whether or not they skipped to just the questions.

4. Get your students to create content and responses

Students can create their own videos and interactives to share with you or their classmates. This delivers an opportunity for students to test their own (and their cohort's) understanding of what has been taught, in a format that is engaging, collaborative and can be completed anywhere at anytime.
